The day's programme will include:

- 'These Dangerous Women' - film about the women who tried to stop the First World War and organised an international peace conference in The Hague on 1915 (made for the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom centenary)
- Speakers on:
 - **Peace and Global Solidarity:** Mary Dobbing, a Quaker from Bristol, who has made several visits to Afghanistan and campaigns against drone warfare
 - **Peacemaking and Politics:** Marie-Lyse Numuhoza (WILPF), draws on her experience of leaving Rwanda after the genocide and involvement with the women's peace movement in Britain
 - **Peacemaking and Personal Life:** Virginia Moffatt, writer and campaigner, reflects on the challenges of balancing work / life / activism / children
 - **Peacemaking and Militarism:** Mia Tamarin (to be confirmed) who served four prison terms as a conscientious objector in Israel
- Time to share ideas in workshops on those topics, and to see the WILPF centenary exhibition.

A conference for women and men too - whether you are involved in a peace organisation, think of yourself as an activist, or are just curious and interested in the issues.
